Born of Magic



(2009 Polston) 36" 5 - 5 1/2" 4-5 way branching, 25 buds. Sev, Tet. This flower is a really nice all-around good garden plant. (Seedling x Spacecoast Starburst) Fertile both ways......\$ 125 SF

Dark Side of the Moon



(2008 Polston) 5" 26" 3-4 way branching 15+ buds, sev tet. Pink Floyd wrote the caption, mother nature did the rest. Hardy to our zone 5 and set off with a very neon green throat. This striking flower would be a good addition to those who are seeking very dark to near black daylilies for their collection. Fertile both ways......\$75 SF

Day of Magic



(2007 Polston) 5 1/2 - 6" 36" 3-way branching, 15 buds, Mid, Hardy Sev, Tet. (Darla Anita x Spacecoast Starburst). Boasting a fantastic pedigree, this one is truly magical. The substance is good, the flowers are consistent. The color is a soft crepe paper pink. This flower holds it's size, even towards the end of it's bloom season. Fertile both ways......

The Fifth Element



(2009 Polston) Boasts an Orange Sherbet color with a white frosted edge and teeth on the back side of The sepals which are inverted and only show from the back. 26" 5" 3-way branching, 15-18 buds. Sev, Tet. (Seedling x Unknown). Fertile both ways...........\$150 SF

Gate Keeper



Hawaiian Coral



(2005 Polston) 34" 51/2" 3-way branching, 18-20 buds, sev-Dor, Tet. (Seedling x Unknown). Petals are a ruffled violet lavender with a washed out eye of gray violet. Yellow pinched throat and a green heart. Fertile both ways.......\$50

(2009 Polston) 26" 5 1/2 3-4 way branching, 15-18 buds. Dor, Tet. (Ruffled Strawberry Parfait x Raspberry Goosebumps). Yet another in an evergrowing list of Polston Introductions showing advanced teeth, IWAV not only has teeth extending out from the petals, but a few curve inwards also giving it an etherial look, thus the name. In addition IWAV is fertile both ways, is already a proven breeder of toothed seedlings and will be a 2009 introduction as Collection Only as we anticipate the demand for this one will be high! Please note that this one only makes medium size fans.

Jack O Lantern Candy



(2008 Polston) 51/2" 3 way branching, 20" 15 buds, sev tet. Pumpkins and Candy Corn are the first things we think of when seeing the color of this beauty for the first time. The blooms are consistent and this one would make a good border accent. The small green throat is just enough to set off the color combo. Fertile both ways......\$100 SF

Long Tall Blonde



(2008 Polston) 3 1/4" 36" 4-5 way branching, 18-20 buds, sev-dor tet. When Lady Betty Fretz first found this one in the early morning she commented on the contrast between the black anthers and the clean yellow color. This 'tall' flower stands to greet gardens visitors. No bending down to look at this one in the clump. Betty suggested this name and we agreed. Fertile both ways.......\$100 SF

A Midsummer Night Dream



(2008 Polston) 5" 24" 3-4 way branching, 15-18 buds sev tet. The bold colors of this flower remind me of a wildly colored sky that comes just after a sun set. The contrast between the dark eye and edge and clean raspberry background color are desirable to the discerning eye. Fertile both ways.....\$100 SF

Road to Hana



(2009 Polston) 28" 51/2" 3- way branching with 16-18 buds. Sev, Tet.Seedling x Spacecoast Starburst. Named after the famous and beautiful Hana Highway on Maui's Northern shore.....this flower has such a beautiful vibrant color that no camera can capture it accurately! Fertile both ways...............\$125 SF

Ticket to Paradise



(2008 Polston) 6 1/2 - 7" 26" 4-5 way branching, 18+ buds, sev tet. Even though our main goal is wide, round and ruffled many garden visitors requested this one to be introduced for its form, branching and bud count. This "Thais" child is fertile both ways.....\$100 SF

HEAVENS TO MURGATROYD

(Murphy 2011) height 52", bloom 8", Early Midseaon bloom, Dormant, Diploid, 23 buds, 3 way branching, bud builder, sunfast, opens well at 50°. Unusual Form Cascade. Cream pink with a feathered purple eye and cream midribs above a chartreuse throat. Won Best Seedling at the 2011 NCDC flower show. Pod and pollen fertile. (Monacan Trail × Just Jessie) Value: \$90



CRABTREE FALLS (Reed 2011) height 38", bloom 8", Midseason bloom, Dormant, Diploid, 16 buds, 2 way branching, Spider Ratio 4.80:1. Cherry red fading to rose and cream midribs above a cream gold to green throat. Tailored and Recurved. Fertility unknown. (unknown × unknown) Value: \$50



WHIP CITY DAYDREAM (Carpenter, D. & Jones, L. 2012) height 34", bloom 6.5", Midseason bloom, Dormant, Tetraploid, 24 buds, 5 way branching, Unusual Form Crispate - Pinched. Dark rose pink above a yellow to green throat. Pollen fertile. (Watusi Warrior x Ron Dunn) Value \$100
