Height 30 in.(76 cm), bloom 6 in.(15 cm), season MLa, Rebloom, Dormant, Tetraploid, 14 buds, 2 branches, Neon yellow orange with slightly lighter midribs, faint darker orange band, extremely toothy edge on petals and sepals, yellow to small olive green throat. ((Ruckus × Pastor Z) × Interview with a Vampire)



Maddie P. (Conway-C., 2017) - \$50

height 38 in.(96 cm), bloom 5.5 in.(13 cm), Semi-Evergreen, Tetraploid, 15 buds, 3 branches, Amethyst petals with outlined violet eye, over brilliant lime green throat, petals outlined in violet with white serrated edge.. (Precious Candy × Edge of Madness)



Lilac Princess (Conway-C., 2017) - \$60

height 28 in.(71 cm), bloom 5.75 in.(14 cm), Semi-Evergreen, Tetraploid, 17 buds, 4 branches, Pink lilac lavender with raspberry outlined eye over a lime green throat, raspberry edge outlined with small ivory edge, ruffled with occasional owl's ears.. (Princess Diana × Purple Peace)



<u>Matrix Bite</u> \$75 (Name pending) (Canterbury Rag Doll x See Me-Feel Me-Touch Me) dormant

stats 38 inch scape, 4 branches, 18 buds, 6 inch bloom

height 34 in.(86 cm), bloom 5.75 in.(15 cm), season M, Semi-Evergreen, Tetraploid, Fragrant, 17 buds, 3 branches, Red violet with yellow toothy edge, small yellow to green throat. (Peppy × Mulberry Breeze)



Truly Madly (Conway-C., 2015) - \$40 Late Bloomer

height 36 in.(91 cm), bloom 5.5 in.(14 cm), season La, Semi-Evergreen, Tetraploid, 34 buds, 5 branches, Pale yellow suffused with pink polychrome, ruffled edge with occasional teeth, large radiating lime green throat. (Truly Angelic × Momentum)



Spell 80 \$50 (name pending) (Apophis x Bonibrae The Freak) dormant DIPLOID, 48 inch scape, 4 branches, 21 buds 7 inch bloom

height 36 in.(91 cm), bloom 5.75 in.(15 cm), season M, Rebloom, Semi-Evergreen, Tetraploid, 17 buds, 3 branches, Bright purple edge with white shark's teeth, small lime green throat. (Baracuda Bay \times Cosmic Sensation)
